Hello MHWC,

Thank you for your patience with this questionnaire.

Mending Strides Ranch has received donations from MHWC in the form of craft products (painted rocks, denim sewing projects and wall hangings) that we sell at events like Mint Hill Madness. We use the funds to help with expenses for the rescued equines who partner in therapy sessions and learning programs with clients. It is helpful to have unrestricted funds available to us because our horse expenses and insurance run \$20,000 a year and while we can generally find grants to cover programs, it is very difficult to get unrestricted funding.

For those unfamiliar with us, we provide equine assisted psychotherapy and learning programs. We work with ages ten and up experiencing low self esteem, anxiety and depression. All programs are supplemented to keep services affordable and full scholarships are available.

We have an ongoing need for individuals to serve on committees and the board. Those with experience in Quickbooks, fundraising, grant writing, event planning, or networking are needed.

We are pleased to present our progress displaying our use of funds given to us by your organization, Mint Hill Women's Club in August 2023. Your award played a crucial role in supporting activities within our HELP program, which focuses on Healing and Eradicating Lingering Poverty in our community. The awarded grant amount of \$1,000 has been instrumental in empowering and uplifting women in need. We are delighted to share an overview of the various types of assistance provided via your

- Clothing: \$875.46
- Food: \$3,339.29
- Transportation: \$3,813.27
- Household Items: \$1,001.68. This category includes the expenses of buying a mattress, paying for storage units, and costs to transport donated furniture to clients.
- Rent and/or Mortgage: \$5,881.08
- Utility Bill Payments: \$1,780.96

The cumulative value of the above-mentioned assistance provided to our clients exceeded \$12,870, demonstrating the significant impact of this program on the lives of those
