

Pat's Place Child Advocacy Center, 901 East Blvd., Charlotte, N.C. 28203, patsplacecac.org Over the past year Pat's Place has worked to improve our community's response to human trafficking of children and young adults. As the lead agency for Mecklenburg County's Project No Rest, we are working to identify the scope of human trafficking in Mecklenburg County. We identify our current capacity and gaps in the service delivery system, and improve outcomes for those who are affected.

We are also working each day to prevent child abuse in our community. We provided professional training to social workers, law enforcement officers, teachers, counselors, and child care professionals. We also conducted child sexual abuse prevention training in schools, youth sports organizations, and houses of worship. Last year, our team trained more than 3,000 adults to recognize the signs and symptoms of abuse. Teaching them to respond appropriately when they witness abuse, and most importantly, prevent child abuse from ever happening. We provide the gift of hope and healing to more than 700 children each year.
